Emergency Tip

Don't have a first aid kit? Add that to the list or build a kit yourself. Just add the following items to your shopping list and assemble a first aid kit. Consider creating a kit for each vehicle as well:

- (20) adhesive bandages, various sizes
- (1) 5" x 9" sterile dressing
- (1) conforming roller gauze bandage
- (2) triangular bandages
- (2) 3 x 3 sterile gauze pads
- (2) 4 x 4 sterile gauze pads
- (1) roll 3" cohesive bandage(2) germicidal hand wipes or sanitizer
- (6) antiseptic wipes
- (2) pair large medical grade non-latex gloves
- (1) roll adhesive tape, 2" width
- Anti-bacterial ointment
- Cold pack
- Scissors and Tweezers
- CPR breathing barrier
- First Aid Manual
- Aspirin or non-aspirin pain reliever
- Anti-diarrhea medication
- Antacid (for stomach upset)
- Syrup of Ipecac (use to induce vomiting)
- Laxative
- Activated charcoal (use if advised by Poison Control)
- Prescription drugs



The Game of Poker History of Poker

Poker may have originated from a 16th century Persian card game known as As Nas. It was probably then taught to French settlers in New Orleans by Persian sailors. Europeans used to call the game 'poque' or 'pochen.' Poque is a French term which in turn evolved from the German term pochen which means to knock. From this it may emerge that the origins of poker could lie in Europe and Persia, however it truly blossomed in the United States. It further increased in popularity when American gambling became popular in western frontier towns to and riverboats.

The legend says that the earliest version of Texas Hold'em was played by Robstown, Texas in the early 1900s. The game is said to have first come to Dallas, Texas, in 1925. The game is then said to have been introduced to Las Vegas by a few Texan gamblers and card players. including Crandell Addington, Doyle Brunson and Amarillo Slim. In 1972, 8 players took part in the World Series of Poker tournament; and thirty years later, the figure shot up to 800. When Chris Moneymaker won the World Series of Poker Main Event in 2003 he was the first player to do so by qualifying at an online poker site. His

How much room do I need for a casino party?

The following guidelines will help you plan for the space you need. The space includes room for the dealers, players, equipment and walking area. We are extremely flexible and can usually work a floor plan around any space limitations you may have.

Blackjack, Poker & Money Wheel – 6ft x 3ft and requires approximately 70 square feet per table

Texas Hold'em – 7ft x 3 1/2ft and requires approximately 80 square feet per table **Roulette** – 7ft x 4ft and requires approximately 90 square feet per table **Small Craps** – 8ft x 4ft and requires approximately 90 square feet per table **Large Craps** – 12ft x 4ft and requires approximately 120 square feet per table.
